WORKS INState Cannabis Programs Should be Leary of the 5th AmendmentPROGRESS(work-in-progress). The Court in U.S. v. Leary struck down the
Marijuana Tax Act of 1937 in its entirety for violating the 5th
Amendment by requiring people to register with the federal
government, thereby certifying their participation in activities that were
illegal under state law. Current state programs require business owners
and individuals to do the same, certifying their violation of federal law.
These registration provisions are inherent in the structure of a state's
regulatory program, and any alternative will necessitate either
recriminalization, decriminalization, or outright legalization.

It Is High Time to Expunge the Past: Evaluating Best Practices for Cannabis Resentencing and Record Clearance Programs (work-inprogress). States that decriminalize or legalize cannabis possession consider retroactive clemency, executive pardons, resentencing, and expungement programs an essential element of social equity. However, these structures and their implementations vary greatly, and best practices need to be developed to inform future state and federal programs.

Leaf(v)ing the Industry: Current State Approaches to Cannabis Industry Insolvencies (work-in-progress). Cannabis illegality at the state and federal level inhibits cannabis industry access to both banking and bankruptcy systems. State specific alternatives have seen some success and should inform federal bankruptcy approaches once cannabis is federally legal.
